After a substantial breakfast, the 38 bus line will take you from Dornbirn station to Ammenegg. From there, you can hike over Schwende and Fohramoos to Bödele, Dornbirn's nature relaxation resort. Here, you can enjoy a traditional lunch in one of the restaurants (e.g. Hotel Restaurant Berghof Fetz or Restaurant Alpenhotel Bödele). After this refreshment, you can continue down to Schwendealp where you can enjoy some homemade cake and coffee. From Schwende, you can walk downhill to Watzenegg and then continue to Haselstauden by bus or by foot.
